GPC Make-Ready Program

Cities utilizing the program:

- (Athens-Clarke County) in the past
- (Savannah) 50 total 45 public for some MRC dollars all EVSE maintenance done by the city
- Decatur
- DeKalb

Thoughts about the program:

- Sharing with residents is difficult b/c it's hard to find service territory delineations because of the EMC's and GPC. So, outreach to the public is complicated.
- More of a benefit to residents than the county
- Need to accompany blanket info with direct help (can't do targeted outreach without understanding who is served by which utility)
- ID greatest need areas served by utilities with programs
- Savannah Earth Day event opportunity to advertise GPC's make ready and other programs. Also putting that info on cities website

Ways to improve the program:

 Could do direct outreach to utilities and offer to be a promotional partner and have them share who to talk to.

Asks for GPC:

- Better company directed battery management programs
- Clarity of expectations what GPC standards are versus local government needs
- School buses as a mobile battery grid reliance
- V2G school bus pilot program Duke doing that GPC could
